President's Message



Happy Mother's Day!

I've been thinking about mothers a lot lately. Although my mother died in 2000, I often find myself saying or doing things just like she did, and it makes me smile! I think that being a mother is the most important job in the world. How else would we pass on our culture, our family traditions, and our family values? Many women I know who do not have children often "adopt" other children to mentor in this way. Women seem to be born with the instincts to nurture and train little ones. Some of us are better than others at this, but we all strive to be our best.

I recently saw the 2004 movie at The Cary Theater, "Iron Jawed Angels," about the women's suffrage movement in 1917-1919. National Woman's Party members were the first to ever picket the White House, but the party leaders protected and prohibited mothers to be on the picket line for fear they would be arrested and put in jail or in mental hospitals with the other picketers for blocking the sidewalk!

Nearly 100 years later, our Cary Woman's Club has been supportive and protective of mothers in our community in our donations to InterAct and their focus on women (mothers) who experience violence in their lives. We have supported fundraisers for our Mature Women Scholarships, for those who are often single mothers going back to college to improve life for their family. And we recently donated funds to Prison

MATCH (Mothers and Their CHildren) to provide opportunities for mothers in prison to have positive interactions and build memories with their children.

The Director of the Prison MATCH program will be a guest at our May 14 luncheon.

In her book, *History of the Woman's Club Movement in America*, written in 1898, shortly before her death in 1901, Jane Cunningham Croly, founder of Sorosis,

which became the General Federation of Women's Clubs, wrote: "The sense of duty is always strong in the woman. Her convictions of duty have made her the most willing and joyful of martyrs, the most faithful and believing of friends, and the only type out of which Nature could form the Mother."


The cost is \$25.00. Your check can be mailed to the Treasurer. Or, please call right away to make your reservation for this important meeting.

Federation Hands

This article came from **Linda Lavinder**, GFWC-NC Chaplain. She presented this Friday morning, April 24, Federation Day, at the annual GFWC-NC Convention in Asheville. We thought our members would enjoy reading it and considering the challenge to use our hands for good in our community!

On this Federation Day, I would like for you to consider your hands and the hands of the women from the 63 clubs that met in 1890 in New York to form the General Federation of Women's Clubs. In some ways our hands are different and in some, they are similar. I dare say in 1890, they would not have been wearing acrylic nails and black nail polish. As today, some would have been very smooth reflecting great care and few years - while others would have been rough and wrinkled from many years of hard work.

Like ours, their hands were engaged in reaching out to meet the needs of their world. In their day, they were dealing with the challenges of industrialization,

urbanization, and immigration. Today we must address poverty, discrimination, terrorism, domestic violence, just to name of few. According to Maya Angelou, "...you shouldn't go through life with a catcher's mitt on both hands; you need to be able to throw something back." Truly, members of the Federation do just that leaving their fingerprints on the world.

After 125 years Federation hands still belong to the proactive, determined, visionary volunteers with a national voice and a local passion. We must use our hands each day to do at least one thing -whether great or small - that will enhance the life of someone else. Our hands are uniquely ours and only we can control what they will do.
